Dr. Schultz is the Clinical Pharmacy Supervisor and PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program Director at Bozeman Deaconess Health Services in Bozeman, Montana. She received her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Creighton University and completed an ASHP-accredited pharmacy practice residency at Group Health Cooperative of Puget Sound. Dr. Schultz was recognized as a Fellow of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) in 2011.

Dr. Schultz has practiced in a variety of hospital practice sites including managed care, a tertiary care medical center, and currently a small community hospital. She has practiced both as a clinical pharmacist and in management, serving as Assistant Director of Pharmacy and Residency Director at Southwest Washington Medical Center in Vancouver, WA prior to relocating to Bozeman. While in Washington State, Dr. Schultz served on the Board of Directors of the Washington State Society of Health-System Pharmacists (WSSHP) and on the Board of Directors for the Washington State Pharmacy Association (WSPA) during the merger of the two state pharmacy associations.

Dr. Schultz has contributed to the advancement of the profession by providing direct patient care and implementing new programs and services at her practice sites, educating pharmacy students and residents, and contributing to the body of knowledge through publications and presentations. She also recently started a new pharmacy practice residency program in a small health-system to provide pharmacy residents an opportunity to train in this type of practice environment.

Dr. Schultz has been an actively engaged member of ASHP, currently serving as Chair for the ASHP Pharmacy Technician Statement Committee which is drafting a Pharmacy Technician Statement. She currently is Chair of the ASHP Joint Section/Forum PPMI Coordinating Committee (JSFPCC), a member of the Center on Pharmacy Practice Advancement Advisory Group (CPPA), a member of the ASHP Section of Inpatient Care Practitioners Pharmacy Technician and Support Services Advisory Group, and Program Chair for an ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting (MCM) presentation. Dr. Schultz's previous ASHP responsibilities have included serving as an Executive Committee member and Chair for the Section of Inpatient Care Practitioners, Chair of the Council on Educational Affairs, Chair of the Task Force for Pharmacy's Changing Demographics, ASHP Foundation's Literature Awards Selection Panel reviewer, program chair for several MCM presentations, and House of Delegates representative for Washington State and Montana.
