What is an Advanced Program?

Definition:

An *advanced-level program* assumes attendees already have a strong foundation in the content area. Information should **expand or deepen existing expertise**, not review basic concepts.

Purpose of ASHP Levels:

- Help attendees select sessions that align with their expertise and learning goals.
- Ensure content is tailored to the appropriate knowledge level.
- Enhance satisfaction and educational value for experienced practitioners.

Characteristics of Advanced Programs:

- Assume familiarity with foundational knowledge speak to peers, not novices.
- Present new evidence, emerging data, or evolving best practices.
- Provide interpretation and synthesis, not repetition of known facts.
- Focus on data-driven, evidence-based content; cite key studies where appropriate.
- Avoid elementary pathophysiology or definitions unless needed for context.
- Incorporate **provocative or forward-looking discussion** (e.g., controversies, predicted trends).
- Position nonpharmacist speakers to present as they would to physicians or executive-level audiences.
